

Interview



Hello, today we have an interview with Raymond Versluis.

He is the teacher of group 7-8 from the Vianova. He is 55 years old and very nice. The interview is about Leonardo Education.

What's the difference between a Leonardo school and a 'normal' school?

On a Leonardo school the children discover a lot of new things, we have a lot of special lessons and we work top-down.

What's top-down?

Top-down is that you first get to see the end product. Then you must look what's necessary to get to the end product. Then you must go to work. An example is this newsletter.

Why do children attend the Vianova?

On other schools they have a problem with the level. The level is too easy for them. The IQ of highly gifted kids is much higher than the IQ of a 'normal' kid.

What's IQ?

IQ stands for intelligence quotient. It's a calculation of your intelligence level. If you have an IQ above 130, you are highly gifted. The average IQ level is 100.

Why are the classes so small?

Because the lessons are complex and in a small class the children get more attention.
